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Dr. George Cybenko is the Dorothy and Walter Gramm Professor of Engineering at Dartmouth College. Dr. Cybenko's current research interests are distributed information and software systems, especially related to security, infrastructure protection and autonomic computing.

Dr. Cybenko is the founding Editor-in-Chief of IEEE Security and Privacy magazine and investigator on projects funded by DHS, DARPA, NSF and ARDA. He has taught on the computer science faculty at Tufts University and was professor of electrical engineering and computer science at the University of Illinois, Champaign-Urbana. At Illinois, he was also a director of the university's Center for Supercomputing Research and Development. He has served as editor for seven mathematics, computer, and information theory publications, has helped organize a dozen conferences and symposia, and has published over one hundred and fifty journal papers, book chapters and conference proceedings. He has also delivered over 100 research lectures at universities, symposia and colloquia around the world.

Dr. Cybenko received his BA in mathematics from the University of Toronto and his Ph.D. in applied mathematics from Princeton. He is a Fellow of the IEEE, a member of the IEEE Computer Society's Board of Governors and a Director of the Computing Research Association.
