Mr. Eddy is the Advisor to Director for Policy at the Domestic Nuclear Detection Office (DNDO) in the Department of Homeland Security (DHS). In his role as Advisor to the Director, he is the primary interface to the DHS Office of Policy and in turn helps to influence overall DHS Policy related to DNDO mission space, namely supply chain security and rad/nuc detection/prevention.

Prior to joining DNDO, Mr. Eddy worked for two and a half years as the Confidential Assistant to the Director for the Office of Science and Technology Policy (OSTP) in the Executive Office of the President. His area of focus centered on homeland and national security policy issues, including biometrics, export control and standards.

Prior to joining OSTP Mr. Eddy worked for three and a half years for the Governor of Arizona. Mr. Eddy was an Executive Management Consultant for the Governor's Office for Excellence in Government (OEG). As a Consultant, he worked closely with a multitude of top level state agency officials in process improvement, team building and facilitations. He taught multiple seminars on customer survey design and analysis. Mr. Eddy served as OEG's Chief Legislative Liaison and assisted in the development of the state's homeland security plan.
