Mr. Fiumara served during a twenty-one year period with the New Castle County (DE) Department of Public Safety, Division of Police (NCCPD), where he was assigned various duties including assignments in the Patrol Division, Criminal Investigation Unit, Evidence Detection Unit and Records Unit.

Mr. Fiumara served as manager of the NCCPD Records Unit and as Terminal Agency Coordinator (TAC), responsible for training and certification of all sworn personnel in policies and procedures related to the National Crime Information Center (NCIC) and Delaware's Criminal Justice Information (DE CJIS) System. Mr. Fiumara also served as liaison between the NCCPD and the FBI.

Mr. Fiumara was a member of the Delaware Justice Information System (DELJIS) Board of Managers, responsible for developing policy and enforcing regulations regarding access and dissemination of information maintained in the DE CJIS System. Mr. Fiumara has also served as an Adjunct Instructor in the Criminal Justice Department of Delaware Technical and Community College.

Upon retirement from the NCCPD in 1996, Mr. Fiumara became Vice President of Technical Services for a DE based system integrator, managing over eighty network and PC professionals.

In July 2001, Mr. Fiumara was named Deputy Chief Technology Officer of the Regional Information Sharing Systems (RISS) Office of Information Technology. RISS is composed of six law enforcement and criminal justice Intelligence Centers serving local, state, tribal, and federal agencies within the United States. Member agencies include Guam, Puerto Rico, and the U. S. Virgin Islands; the southern border provinces of Canada, the United Kingdom and Australia.

The RISS Office of Information Technology includes the Intranet Operations Group (IOG) and the Applications Development Group (ADG). The primary responsibility of the IOG is ensuring secure operability of the RISS intranet (RISSNET) that provides information sharing capability to the RISS Intelligence Centers and to other law enforcement and justice agency systems. The primary responsibility of the ADG is to provide software development, implementation, and maintenance in support of RISS information collection, storage, and dissemination needs.
