Dr. Shwaery has served as the Director of NTIC on the campus of the University of New Hampshire since August of 2001. NTIC serves as the academic outreach arm of the Joint Non-lethal Weapons Directorate's (JNLWD) technology R&D effort.

Accepting this position allowed Dr. Shwaery to return to UNH, where he received his Ph.D. in 1994 focusing on physiology and biochemistry. He assumed the post of Director at NTIC in only its second year of existence. Since then, the center has increased its competitive proposal response fourfold and has recruited some of the nation's top academic laboratories to participate in non-lethal technology development.

Dr. Shwaery's center has recently expanded to house a Critical Infrastructure Dependability laboratory and a Transatlantic Security team based at UNH. He has served as the DoD technology representative at the NATO SAS 040 Multinational Exercise, "Non-lethal Weapons and Peace Enforcement Operations", predicting scenarios and technologies out to 2020. He also chaired a recent panel at the Potomac Institute for Policy Studies on "Efficacy and Safety of Electrical Stun Devices".

Dr. Shwaery is one of two representatives from UNH participating in the University and Agency Partnership Initiative hosted at the Naval Postgraduate School's Center for Homeland Defense and Security.
