Mr. Garbarino is a Project Manager with the National Infrastructure Institute (NI²) Center for Infrastructure Expertise (CIE) in Portsmouth NH. At CIE, Mr. Garbarino divides his efforts between the Canada United States Cargo Security Project, the Safe and Secure Schools Project and other special projects.

Directly after finishing his undergraduate work, Mr. Garbarino moved to London, England and accepted a position with the Westminster City Council Government of London. As a United States citizen, Mr. Garbarino worked on public properties assisting tenants, many of which were Middle Eastern refugees seeking asylum in Great Britain or awaiting hearings to be administered by the Commonwealth of Great Britain. In 2001, Mr. Garbarino returned to the United States.

Upon his return to the United States, Mr. Garbarino began working with FleetBoston Financial as a Business Development and Strategy Associate. At Fleet, Mr. Garbarino was responsible for the Daily management of Fleet's Customer Management Database. The database used SIEBEL systems to track 26 lines of business within the bank. Emphasis was placed on protecting sensitive financial information. Mr. Garbarino trained Fleet Sales team members in effective information management, information protection and administered overall system data/information quality.

Along with his work experiences, Mr. Garbarino is a member of Infragard Connecticut, a group providing public/private sector partnerships for the protection of local, state and national infrastructure. Mr. Garbarino is certified in National Incident Management Systems IS-700 which seeks to create a unified command structure during times of emergency. He has also completed the ISO 9001:2000 Quality Management Systems requirements overview at the University of New Hampshire. Mr. Garbarino also participated as an Exercise Controller in TOPOFF3, which was the largest terrorism training drill ever completed.
